Rules

- All entries must be made with fibers which are at least 60% natural and finished within the last year.
- Maximum of two entries per class.
- When possible, attach a 3x5 card with each exhibit which lists the material(s) used, technique(s) used, and intended use.
- A participant may enter as Amateur in a class, if they (1) have had little or no training, and (2) do their craft for pleasure, and (3) have not been doing their craft for more than five years, and (4) have not won a rosette at any fair or art show, and (5) have not been paid to teach a workshop or class.
- A participant must enter as Professional in their area(s) of

expertise, if they (1) do not meet the criteria of Amateur above, or (2) primarily produce their work for sale, or (3) have a degree or certificate.

6. Superintendent reserves the right to change classes on any item if entered into an inappropriate category.
7. Artist Challenge: The participant picks their best entry to go up against the best of the best in all Fiber Art divisions. One entry only.
8. Collaborations: When entering in the 1-2 or 3-4 person categories enter under one name on the entry form and fill in the other names on the entry tag before attaching. Under the group category, enter under the group's name. Entries are eligible for the Overall Grand Championship but not individual Best of Show awards.

Rules

- Each fleece entered must have been grown by a Fremont County resident and have been shorn in 2009 or 2010. Each fleece must not have more than 12 month's growth, except that a yearling fleece will be allowed up to 16 month's growth.
- See qualifications and preparation of fleeces in Junior Wool Section. This section is for Youth Not in 4-H or FFA.
- Exhibitors may exhibit (3) entries per class.
- Fleeces will be exhibited in the Armory with the Fiber Arts exhibit.
- Fleeces will be shown in clear plastic bags.
- Definitions: White must be all white, everything else is colored.
- Spinning fleeces must be skirted, should be very clean and of high quality intended for spinning. The fleece should be properly folded, but not tied.
- Farm flock fleeces must be skirted; should be reasonably clean and of quality for commercial preparation as roving. The fleece should be properly folded, but not tied.
- Range wool should conform to the rules for fleece quality and preparation as needed in the Junior Wool Section.
- If a fleece is from a purebred sheep, write the breed and gender of the sheep on a 3 X 5 card and attach it to the entry.

Rules

- Pocket Pet classes are open only to qualified Fremont County residents. Entries are due by 5:00 p.m., July 15.
- Pocket Pets are considered to be any small rodent, bird, amphibian, reptile or any other special creature that an exhibitor has as a pet or has as a special 4-H project. Cats, dogs, poultry, and rabbits are not eligible.
- Pocket Pets are to be brought to the Fair on Saturday, August 7 by 9 am. Animals must be checked in at the Event Tent by 9 am or they may be ineligible to show. Check in with the Show Superintendent in the Event Tent for show information and materials. All Pocket Pets are to be brought in the day of the show and taken home upon completion of the show.
- All Pocket Pets must be confined to an ESCAPE PROOF CAGE OR CONTAINER, suitable for that particular species, while they are on the fairgrounds. Exhibitors must provide their own cages. It is the total responsibility of the exhibitor to provide for the health and welfare of the animal while it is at the Fremont County Fair.
- Exhibitors may be asked to discuss and have a knowledge of their pet and may be asked to handle their pet at the judge's discretion.
- Any pet showing signs of illness will be removed from the grounds immediately at the discretion of the Show Superintendent.
- Animals must be owned by the exhibitor by July 1, 2010 to show at the Fair.
