<b>Kidz Stuff</b>	For children 8 and under, not enrolled in 4-H
<b>Youth</b>	Ages 9 through 19
<b>Amateur</b>	Refers to those who have not previously won. The amateur generally does their craft for pleasure and has had little or no training.
<b>Advanced Amateur</b>	Refers to those a little more advanced than the amateur.
<b>Professional</b>	Refers to those whose work is produced primarily for the purpose of selling; or who have a diploma, Certificate, degree, or three or more years of school training; or teach in their art media.
<b>Senior Citizen</b>	Ages 70 years or over
