Level 2 Quilter - Yes to the following:

- Won first place in a major quilt show?
- Teaches classes outside of own group for money?
- Judges quilts at fairs or major quilt shows?
- Sold work for large monetary reward?

Level 1 Quilter – No to all four questions above

Rules

1. Items must have been completed from August 10, 2008 to July 19, 2010. (Now a 2 year rule) You may have started your quilt after August of 2007. Only quilts entered in the "My First Quilt" contest are exempt from this rule.
2. All items must be prepared for hanging with quilt pocket (may be temporary). Pocket must be at least 4" wide. No Straight pins.
3. Articles must be entirely complete and clean, or they will not be accepted for judging.
4. If a combination of techniques are used, that which requires the larger amount of work will specify the exhibit category.
5. Superintendent reserves the right to change classes on any item if entered into an inappropriate category.
6. Specify if article is a group quilt (done in ANY part by more than ONE person) or if the entrant is under 12 years of age.
7. All exhibits must be checked in with the Superintendent
8. All exhibits must have some type of quilting; meaning the quilting stitch must go through the Top, Batting, and Backing of the exhibit.
9. Quilted clothing should be entered into sewing or wearable art.
10. Only one entry per class.

Judging Criteria

- Quality of work
- Amount of work in relation to use
- Suitability of design, color, and line
- Originality of design

Note Class definitions!

Senior quilter – 70 years or older

Kit quilt – made with pre-printed panels

Group Quilt – 3 or more people have work in quilt

- A – LEVEL 1 HAND QUILTED
- B – LEVEL 1 MACHINE QUILTED
- C – LEVEL 1 COMMERCIALY QUILTED
- D – LEVEL 2 HAND QUILTED
- E – LEVEL 2 MACHINE QUILTED
