Rules

- Each fleece entered must have been grown by a Fremont County resident and have been shorn in 2009 or 2010. Each fleece must not have more than 12 month's growth, except that a yearling fleece will be allowed up to 16 month's growth.
- See qualifications and preparation of fleeces in Junior Wool Section. This section is for Youth Not in 4-H or FFA.
- Exhibitors may exhibit (3) entries per class.
- Fleeces will be exhibited in the Armory with the Fiber Arts exhibit.
- Fleeces will be shown in clear plastic bags.
- Definitions: White must be all white, everything else is colored.
- Spinning fleeces must be skirted, should be very clean and of high quality intended for spinning. The fleece should be properly folded, but not tied.
- Farm flock fleeces must be skirted; should be reasonably clean and of quality for commercial preparation as roving. The fleece should be properly folded, but not tied.
- Range wool should conform to the rules for fleece quality and preparation as needed in the Junior Wool Section.
- If a fleece is from a purebred sheep, write the breed and gender of the sheep on a 3 X 5 card and attach it to the entry.

Rules

- Pocket Pet classes are open only to qualified Fremont County residents. Entries are due by 5:00 p.m., July 15.
- Pocket Pets are considered to be any small rodent, bird, amphibian, reptile or any other special creature that an exhibitor has as a pet or has as a special 4-H project. Cats, dogs, poultry, and rabbits are not eligible.
- Pocket Pets are to be brought to the Fair on Saturday, August 7 by 9 am. Animals must be checked in at the Event Tent by 9 am or they may be ineligible to show. Check in with the Show Superintendent in the Event Tent for show information and materials. All Pocket Pets are to be brought in the day of the show and taken home upon completion of the show.
- All Pocket Pets must be confined to an ESCAPE PROOF CAGE OR CONTAINER, suitable for that particular species, while they are on the fairgrounds. Exhibitors must provide their own cages. It is the total responsibility of the exhibitor to provide for the health and welfare of the animal while it is at the Fremont County Fair.
- Exhibitors may be asked to discuss and have a knowledge of their pet and may be asked to handle their pet at the judge's discretion.
- Any pet showing signs of illness will be removed from the grounds immediately at the discretion of the Show Superintendent.
- Animals must be owned by the exhibitor by July 1, 2010 to show at the Fair.

8. Youth Exhibitors: Exhibits in class 6 cannot be the same as current 4-H static exhibits.
9. Ribbons provided for each Pocket Pet, with a cash payout during the show for top placing exhibits.
10. Premier pocket pet exhibitor shall be determined by most points accumulated in classes 1 to 5. Points awarded as follows:
1st place received 4 points through 4th place receiving 1 point.

Regulations:

1. All exhibitors will abide by all applicable policies of the Fremont County Fair.
2. Competition is open to any interested pickup truck owner in Wyoming.
3. Each exhibitor in this contest, in making application for entry is required to pay a processing fee of \$5 per entry (classes 1-6).
4. All exhibits in this division must be owned by the exhibitor. Exhibitors may enter up to three (3) pickups but each pickup truck entered must be operational and arrive on grounds on its own power.
5. Pickup entries are to be delivered to the paved, open area north of the Armory Building and east of the Main Hall, on Saturday, July 31, 7:00 am to 9:00 am.
6. Each pickup must be displayed with quality outdoor signage which describes the make, model, year (built), how modified (if applicable). Each sign to have owners name and contact information on the back.
7. All judging will be done by popular vote by guests of the Fair: People's Choice. Judging criteria will include eye appeal, quality of modifications and maintenance of the vehicle.
8. Awards and Premiums: class Winners/Best of Show in classes S-2-11 to S-2-15 each win \$25 and a rosette.
9. Winners from classes 7-15 may participate in the Fair Parade at 6 pm, July 31 on Main Street.
