**MARKET GOATS**  
 Superintendent - Charleen VonKrosigk

Rules

1. Review Junior Livestock Rules. No artificial color, paint or powders are to be used on the animals.
2. Limit of two goats per exhibitor.
3. All market goats should be dehorned. If horns are present, the horns must be blunted and not exceed two inches in length. No fresh dehorning will be allowed.
4. Market goats must be uniformly slick shorn with 3/8" of hair or less at the time of show. Legs may have hair up to the hock and knee only.
5. Market goats may be wethers or non-bred does. Market goats are to have milk teeth in place or may have lost one or both of their milk teeth, but there shall be no evidence of breaking skin or eruption of the two permanent front teeth. Any discrepancies or questions as to the status of milk teeth shall be decided by the superintendent.
6. Market goats must have Boer characteristics & weigh a minimum of 70 lbs, with no set upper weight limit. Underweight market goats will show for ribbons and premiums, but will not sell. Goats need to be of a meat goat breed absolutely no dairy goats.
7. Exhibitors will be allowed to show market goats with halters or collars.
8. Classes will be broken by weight at the discretion of the superintendent using logical weight break divisions.

3. Each group of five females will be allowed two additional handlers to help set up and exhibit the group. All seven exhibitors must be Junior Dairy Cattle Exhibitors and represent the respective club or chapter being shown.
4. Dairy Herd to be judged on overall appearance, uniformity and dairy cattle quality. Showmanship, appearance, and attitude of exhibitors will also be considered.

Rules

1. Exhibitors may have two entries in a class providing the entries are of different breeds.
2. Cockerals and Pullets must be hatched during the current year, except Bantams which may be any age, up to two years old.
3. A trio consists of one male and two female birds.
4. Poultry entered in Junior Division are not eligible to compete in Open Class and Vice-Versa.
5. Exhibitors must be present to assist during the judging of their birds.
6. No poultry shall be sold or removed until release time.
7. No birds shall leave without consent of the superintendent.
8. You must clean cages before leaving the Fair.
9. Review the Junior Livestock Rules.
10. **ENTRY INFORMATION:** The Class code must include the department letter, the Division number and Class number.  
 EXAMPLE: If you are entering Young Trio in a Standard Frizzle Class; your class entry would be J-16-36 (J for Youth Department; 16 for Poultry Division; and 8 for Young Trio – other breeds class).
11. Premium payouts in this division shall follow the American system.

- A Cock; male fowl one year and older
- B Cockerel; male fowl less than one year old
- C Hen; female fowl one year old and older
- D Pullet; female fowl less than one year old
- E Mature Trio; one cock and two hens of same breed and variety, one year old and older
- F Young Trio; one cockerel and two pullets of the same breed and variety

**PIGEONS**

Rules

1. All birds must be banded with a seamless band in order to be shown.
2. All birds must be owned by the exhibitor.
3. Classes will be combined or divided as necessary.
4. Substitutions may be made only in same class or color.
5. Sick or diseased birds will not be allowed on the grounds.
6. Exhibitor may show one bird per class, except in "Any other Breed" Classes. In Any Other Breed Classes, an exhibitor may show any number of birds as long as they show only one bird per breed per class. E.g. If you have Ark Angels, you may show one old cock, one old hen, one young cock, and one young hen as any other breed. You could also show Thi Laufers –one old cock, one old hen, one young cock and one young hen. Please write the breed of your birds on your entry form.
7. Exhibitors must be present to assist handling during judging.
8. Exhibitor must clean cages during and before leaving fair.
