

Standards and Wyoming Livestock Board Rules and Regulations.

6. CONDITION OF SALE ANIMALS – All animals offered for sale must conform to the USDA WHOLESOME MEAT ACT.

- A. All animals must be in good health and carcasses free of drugs and chemical residues.
 - B. Antibiotics and sulfonamide have met the required withdrawal periods.
 - C. Drug label directions for use and withdrawal periods must be followed.
 - D. If drug and other chemical residues are found in the tissue of a carcass, the entire carcass may be condemned. If drugs or other chemical residues are found in tissue of carcasses of animals sold through the sale connected with the Fremont County Fair, said Show will in no way be liable or responsible for the condition of the carcass or sale price of the animals.
7. The Exhibitor shall show and sell his or her own animal, with emergency situations being decided by the Junior Livestock Sales Board
8. An exhibitor will be allowed to sell one market animal (beef, lamb, hog, goat) except rabbits and poultry which are sold as a pen of three animals.
- 9. HOW TO CONSIGN YOUR ANIMAL FOR SALE**
- A. The sale secretary will be located in the scale house.
 - B. Office hours for consigning will end one hour following the swine, lamb, goat and beef shows.
 - C. All consignments will be handled in the Scale House not at the Fair Office.
 - D. If you are showing only one animal and wish to sell it, you must consign that animal.
 - E. When to consign:
You must consign your chosen animal to sell within one hour following the respective market show. For example: If you want to sell your market hog, as soon as the market swine show is over, you need to consign your hog with the sale secretary in the scale house. If you are thinking of selling your hog, but are showing a market beef also and might want to sell the beef instead, see the sale secretary and inform her that you may want to sell your hog immediately following the show and inform her that you are showing a beef and may want to sell it instead. Do this for any market animal you may be consigning.

CONSIGNMENTS WILL CLOSE ONE HOUR AFTER THE BEEF SHOW ON FRIDAY, AUGUST 6th IF YOU ARE SHOWING A MARKET ANIMAL AND DO NOT WISH TO SELL IT AT THE JUNIOR LIVESTOCK SALE, PLEASE INFORM THE SECRETARY.

***IF YOU PLAN TO SHOW AN ANIMAL AT THE WYOMING STATE FAIR, YOU MUST INDICATE SO ON THE CONSIGNMENT FORM. YOU MUST HAVE THE PERMISSION OF YOUR EXTENSION AGENT OR FFA ADVISOR IN ORDER TO SHOW AT THE WYOMING STATE FAIR.**

- 10. A. If an exhibitor is fortunate enough to have two animals of different species that are Champion or Reserve Champion he/she may sell both animals.
 - B. All resales will have to be verified by Jr. Livestock Sales Board Member at salebarn. Set delivery times will be announced upon receipt of sale date information from Riverton Livestock Auction.
 - C. All rabbits and poultry must be delivered and/or processed according to buyer's direction.
11. Dress Code:
Collared shirts (cap sleeve, short sleeve or long sleeve – no

sleeveless); shirts that button up to the neck, Polo shirts are acceptable.

Not Allowed: T-shirts, tank tops, halter tops, tube tops. No Mid-driffs (stomachs) showing. No shorts. No sandals.

You will be asked to leave the sale and change if you do not adhere to the dress code. No exceptions.

- 12. The Junior Livestock Sale Board will automatically deduct a set percentage from the gross sale price of each animal.
- 13. All animals sold through the Junior Livestock Sale will automatically be insured by the Board for a period of 60 days. Insurance fees will be deducted from the sellers check.
- 14. A. After the Junior Livestock Sale, each exhibitor is asked to take his/her animal home.
B. All costs are the sellers responsibility until the animal is delivered to processing or other arrangement.
C. On Monday following the Fair call the Fair Office at 856-6611:
 - 1. Double check on who your buyer is.
 - 2. Ask if the animal is to be processed, resold or delivered to the buyer.
 - 3. **THE BUYER, NOT THE SELLER DESIGNATES THE PROCESSOR**
 - 4. **IT IS YOUR RESPONSIBILITY TO DELIVER THE ANIMAL TO THE DESIGNATED PROCESSOR ON THE SCHEDULED PROCESSING DATE.**
- 15. Write a thank you note to your buyer. Thank you note shall be delivered to the Sale Secretary on Sale Day or within 15 days following the sale at the Fair Office. Thank you note should be unsealed, with the proper name and return address, and be properly addressed to the buyer.
- 16. Enforcement Clause
Failure to follow these rules will be reviewed by the Fremont County Jr. Livestock Sales Board and appropriate action will be taken. Actions may include loss of sale privileges for current or subsequent years at the Fremont County Jr. Livestock Sale. All Fremont County Jr. Livestock Sales Board decisions shall be final.
- 17. Sellers may expect to receive their check 30-60 days after the Fremont County Junior Livestock Sale Board has received the buyer's check or funds. No checks will be issued prior to September 10, 2010.

2. Animals in this contest must have been tagged at the Fremont County tagging for Market Beef.

COMMERCIAL COW CONTEST

Superintendent - Fremont County Cattlemen's Ass'n

Rules

1. Please review Junior Livestock Rules; as all rules will apply to this contest.
2. 4-H or FFA members must be enrolled in the Breeding Beef Project.
3. A panel of four judges, including the official beef judge and three commercial cattlemen chosen by the Fremont County Cattlemen will judge the contest.
4. Exhibitors must bring their completed Commercial Cow Record Book to the weigh-in and turn in at scale house Thursday, by 5:00 pm.
5. You may also enter these same cattle in Division 1 – Junior Breeding Beef.

Rules (Phase 1)

1. The yearling heifer must have been weighed and identified at the County Fair Tagging.
2. The heifer (bred at least 30 days) will be shown at halter.

Rules (Phase 2)

1. Cow (bred at least 30 days) must have been shown in Phase 1 in 2009.
2. Cow (calved prior to fair) and calf will be shown at halter.
3. The cow and calf will be judged as a pair and the record book will be evaluated. Both the cow and calf will be weighed at weigh in.

Score Card for Judging
