

Fremont County Fair Prospect Jackpot
June 5th and 6th, 2009

Entry Rules

- Open to any 4-H and FFA members (19 years or younger 1-1-09)
- Entry fee of \$5.00 per animal for Lambs, Market Goats and Hogs and \$10 for beef. \$1.00 at the gate for showmanship classes. \$1.00 will be withheld from each entry for office charges. Entry fees will be paid back according to number in each class. **NO REFUNDS**
- All entry blanks are due at the Fair Office by Wednesday, June 3rd, 2009 - No phone entries
- Late entries will be accepted, however, there is a late fee of \$2.00 per entry.
- Entry blanks must be signed by the participant, and the parent or guardian if under 18 years old. **ENTRY BLANKS NOT PROPERLY SIGNED WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED**
- Showmanship will be divided into two age groups: as of 1/1/09 Junior 8-13, Senior 14-19
- You must use your own animal for showmanship classes
- Management reserves the right to combine or divide classes as needed
- **ANIMALS MUST BE OWNED BY THE EXHIBITOR SHOWING. YOU CANNOT SHOW FAMILY OWNED ANIMALS.**

Health Rules

- All animals must conform to Wyoming State health and brand requirements
- Any animal showing symptoms of a contagious or infectious disease may be removed from the premises at the discretion of the Fair Board or their designated representative
- **Any lamb exhibiting any stage of show lamb fungus will not be allowed to unload.**

Classification Rules

- Steers will be hip measured and weighed, hogs, goats and lambs will be weighed
- Lambs must have been sheared with no more than 1/4 inch pelt or slick shorn within the prior week, with no patterns. Lambs must have their baby teeth
- Goats must be slick sheared and have baby teeth
- All animals will be sorted by a committee at the scales during weigh-in to determine proper class

Ethics and Conduct Rules

- Do not tie any animal with its head pulled abnormally high you will be disqualified
- Direct criticism or interference with the judge, show management, other exhibitors, or show officials before, during or after the show is prohibited you will be disqualified
- Abusive or inhumane treatment of any animal will not be allowed, while handling, fitting or showing. Breaking tails, striking an animal to cause swelling or for bracing purposes, and the use of electrical devices will not be permitted. You will be disqualified. **Do not hold lambs off the ground while showing.**
- All animals shall be free of all drugs. If there is suspicion they can and will be tested. If animal found positive for illegal drugs you **shall not** be permitted to show on these grounds **ever again**.
- Treatment of an animal internally or externally with any irritant, counter irritant, or other substances used to change the conformation or appearance of an animal is prohibited. You will be disqualified.
- The use of tranquilizers, sedatives, or depressants which alter the physical or physiological state of the animal is prohibited, unless prescribed by Fair Board Veterinarian.

- Injections or insertion of any foreign materials under the skin and or into the flesh of an animal is prohibited. You will be disqualified. Surgically removing ribs, vertebrae or altering the contour appearance of any animal is prohibited. You will be disqualified. Any liquid or substance that is not considered part of an accepted and normal diet for livestock is prohibited. You will be disqualified.
- The Fremont County Fair reserves the right to test any animals officially entered, for foreign substances including drugs, chemicals or feed additives. As a prior condition to accepting an entry any, entry blank signed by the exhibitor, their parent or legal guardian grants the Fremont County Fair Board permission to test the entry.

Fitting and Showing Rules

- Exhibitors must be able to control their livestock for weigh-in and showing; otherwise the animals will be disqualified and must be taken from the grounds. Members must accompany and exhibit their own livestock. But in case of two animals in the same class, another Wyoming 4-H or FFA member may show one of the animals. While in the show ring the person showing the animal must do so without aid, and all adults, except those qualified to be in the show ring, must remain away from the animals, unless helping to secure a loose or run-away animal. As always safety is the number one priority.
- Livestock Exhibitors are expected to care for their own animals while at the Fremont County Fair Prospect Jackpot Show.
- **FITTING**
Senior Member - is expected to fit his or her own animals at the show. No assistance by Parents, Leaders or Advisors.
Junior Member - Any assistance give to a 4-H or FFA member should be a learning experience for the member. A teacher or adult leader is allowed only to show or teach the member a fitting or showing technique or skill on the animal prior to the show. However, the exhibitor is expected to perform the majority of each technique and/or skill.
- While showing your animals always appear neat and well groomed, use good sportsmanship, showmanship, and character, be honest do the right thing.
- Clean your pens or stalls before leaving the Show.

Enforcing the Rules

- **THE FREMONT COUNTY FAIR BOARD RESERVES THE FINAL AND ABSOLUTE RIGHT TO INTERPRET THE RULES AND REGULATIONS AND THEIR DECISION WILL BE FINAL**

Third Choice – Fair Staff

If the matter is not resolved to your satisfaction you may file protest. Instructions for “Protests” are available at the Fair Office.

- Each report of rules being broken will be reviewed by the Fair Board and appropriate action will be taken.
